Second Year Offering the 101 Parent/Coach Course

- We did 32 101 Parent/Coach Course up from just 5 course the year before
- We reached over 630 Recreation Parent Coaches 2014 YTD over 500 more coaches than in 2013

What is the 101 Parent/Coach Course? Has Your club taken advantage of this program

The program is 45 minutes of classroom instructions that includes

- The balance between activities and players abilities
- Building a lesson plan from Simple to Complex

The program also includes 45 minutes of on field instructions

- Demonstrate warm up activities
 1. various age group types
- Demonstrate 1 ball to 1 player U6 activities
- Demonstrate 1 ball to 2 player U8 Activities
- Demonstrate 1 ball to 3-4 player U10-u12 Activities
- Small sided games and activities

Bridging the 101 Course to the "Coaching 100 Series", E License and Beyond

The NYSW Coaching Education director in conjunction with NYSW Recreation Director has outlined a plan to help Recreation coaches continue down the coaching education continuum.

We are now offering the "Coaching 100 Series" to Clubs:

- Once you have taken the 101 Course We will come back to a club and teach any one of our 10 "Coaching 100 Series" courses to the Recreation coaches
- Once clubs have exhausted the "Coaching 100 Series" and have an established group of coaches in the community we will then take them to another level with the USYSA 'E' License.



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Expand The NYSW Recreation Festivals

The goal of these events is to fulfill a requirement of the recreation initiative to demonstrate to coaches and recreation directors the value of small sided game environments. The other goal is to have recreation player watch and see a higher level soccer game to encourage them to stay involved in the game and expand their love for the game beyond the age of 12. **We expanded our demographics with the addition of Binghamton and Buffalo Markets**

- Partnerships with Rhinos, Lancers and Syracuse Silver Knights, Binghamton Sports Complex and Shalen's Sports Complex (Buffalo)
- **We reached 90 different Recreation Clubs in 5 different events in 2014**
- Over 3000 Recreation Coaches and Recreation Players reaches

Demographics of the Participating Recreation Soccer Club

- 22% Participation from Syracuse District
- 6 % Participation from Southern Tier **up 6% previous Year**
- 29% Participation from Rochester District
- 15% Participation from Buffalo District **up 9% previous Year**
- 8% Participation form Twin Tiers District **up 2% from previous Year**
- 20% Participation from Binghamton District **up 2% previous Year**

Expand Recreation Festivals to local Communities in 2015

Our Goal is to provide a turnkey set up and design program for Recreation Festivals that can be held in your local recreation soccer communities. We would like to establish a relationship with individual clubs to see if that can make these events happen in their area on a regular basis. The hope is that host clubs would invite surrounding recreation programs to participate in these small sided festivals. Mirroring what we have demonstrated with the sponsored NYSW programs. We will give Recreation director all the tools, resources and support to help build this programs in your community.

Recreation Soccer Camp (NEW 2014)

Winter of 2014 we offered our first recreation Soccer camp in conjunction with Rochester Lancers. The lancers graciously donated the field to us for the day. We had **180 kids registered** from the entire NYSW foot print. The Ages range was Under 8 to Under-12 Recreation Players. This was an hour and half camp. The coaching staff was comprised of the NYSW Olympic Development Staff Coaches.

- Additional Recreation Soccer Camps were run in the southern Tier and Twin Tier areas.
- **We are looking to offer more regional Recreation Soccer Camps during 2015**



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Provide voice for Recreation Programs in NYSWYSA

We listen to the needs of recreation program. They needed a training course that was of little cost and allowed for many to take advantage. Therefore we designed the 101 Parent/Coach Course.

With over 240 volunteer man hours in the last 12 months dedicated to Recreation Soccer. NYSWYSA has decided to expand the role of the Recreation Soccer Initiative to include a paid staff who can dedicate even more hours to Recreation Soccer. The goal is to have this person reach recreation players and recreation coaches and be an active role in their organizations. This active role will provide that expanded voice for Recreation soccer within the NYSWYSA organization.

Hired NEW dedicated staff to Recreation Soccer:

April of 2014 we hired Assistant Technical Director, Scott Craig to the NYSW Staff. Scott is a paid staff member. His role is to help develop and expand recreation initiatives in the NYSW footprint. He will have other responsibilities outside of recreation soccer for NYSW. Scott has made a large impact in a short period of time.

We essentially now have two people with a heightened focus on the recreation soccer community; the Recreation Director and the Assistant Technical Director. We look forward to reaching out to all the Recreation clubs in 2015 and offering of our services to help expand your programs.
